World Society, Democracy and Ethnic Peace: Ethnopolitics of Democratic Consolidation in Europe, South and East

The conducted project work was focused on investigation of meanings and patterns of articulation of the ethnic level of emergent world society, its structure and transformations, particularly, as these are shaped by the unfolding dynamics of the third wave of democratization (Huntington 1991) in multiethic countries. The project's theoretical framework on issues of ethnic peace was applied to a comparative study of ethnopolitical conflict management in a sample of East European countries (Baltic states, Romania, Moldova). Typological parallels, where appropriate, were made with similar processes and outcomes in the earlier cluster of democratic transitions and consolidations in South Europe (Spain, Italy).

The research was carried out during 6 months of full-time project involvement (February-April 1999 – data-gathering stage and July-August, November 1999 – research and writing stage) in affiliation with the Berghof Research Center for Constructive Conflict Management (Berlin, Germany). The data gathering included, besides library research, work at specialised collections of data, including OSCE Archives in Warsaw and Open Society Archives in Budapest).
